- one additional beginning year (or, the quarter 3 equivalent) of a different language (in some cases, 3+ years of high school language credit can be used for this by petition)

Note: This is intended as a **suggested** plan of study only - each individual student's circumstances will by necessity customize this plan. While many students do finish Global Studies major requirements quickly enough to graduate early, the major is **impacted** and therefore <u>cannot</u> <u>guarantee</u> an early graduation for any student (just an on-time graduation, within 4 years). The department also cannot guarantee access to every course in every quarter - it is each student's responsibility to make sure they are reading all posted and emailed advising information in order to graduate on schedule.
